I-35 May Updates

Hello Roadrunner Country! We are excited to graduate our seniors and we wish them well in whatever they choose to accomplish next. Seniors, we are proud to call you Interstate 35 School Alumni. Graduation will be May 24, 2020. We will have a ceremony at 2:00 p.m. (By invite only) at the school and a parade beginning around 3:00 p.m. (Truro to New Virginia to St Charles). Please plan to greet students on your porch or along the parade route (found on the district website). Please follow all social distancing guidelines for the parade.

Return to Learn Plan. Each school district in the state of Iowa is required to have a Return to Learn Plan submitted to the Department of Education by July 1. One of the components of the plan must include a Continuous Learning Plan that has required learning for grades K-12. (Our current Continuous Learning Plan has required learning for grades 9-12 and voluntary learning for grades PK-8). We are working on developing a plan that is equitable and provides for rich learning opportunities for all of our students. We are rethinking how we offer education!

We are looking for parents interested in serving on our Return to Learn plan panel. We will present ideas for our Return to Learn plan and get feedback from the panel throughout the process. Free Breakfast and Lunch Program. All students 2-18 are eligible for free breakfast and lunch through our summer feeding program—which is happening now, through the end of June! If you are interested in signing your student(s) up for breakfast and lunch, please contact the district office at 641-765-4291. Our pick up locations are at the Lion's Shelter in New Virginia, the Lion's Hall in St Charles, and the entry to the high school in Truro.

Schools Out For Summer. The last day new learning will be going out to students is Monday, May 18. Students are asked to get all work in to teachers by Wednesday, May 27th.

While it has been a crazy end to the 2020 school year—we are excited about summer and being recharged and ready to go in the fall.

Preschool Registration. Preschool registration is underway at Interstate 35 Elementary School. If you have a student that will be three on or before Sept 15, please consider enrolling him/her in our three year old preschool program. This is a half day morning program. We also provide wrap around care for our three year olds. There is cost associated with this program. If you are interested, please contact our 3 year old teacher Kristen Harris at kharris@roadrunnerpride.org

We also have spots available in our 4 year old preschool program. If your child will be 4 on or before September 15, this may be an option for you. We currently offer a half day free program, a full day program with some additional costs and a full day program with wrap around care. If you have any questions, we encourage you to contact our Preschool Director, Jenny Dickinson at jdickinson@roadrunnerpride.org

Summer Daycare. Our daycare will be open this summer and we are currently REGISTERING STUDENTS!

The daycare will still only be available to current school age children (3 year old PK during the 19-20 school year and up). The daycare will be closed during the first week of June, and from June 29-July 3 to allow the custodial crew to get the summer cleaning done in the area. There will not be breakfast or lunch provided, so children will need to provide a sack lunch. AM and PM snacks with milk/juice will be provided.

You can contract to attend either 3, 4, or 5 days a week for \$25 per child/per day. 1 or 2 days a week will pay the drop-in rate of \$30 per day. There will be a field trip every week to an out of town activity. Bussing will be provided. There will be additional local in town trips as well (library, park, etc). There is a \$100 fee to cover the cost of field trips, with \$50 due at the beginning of June and the other \$50 due at the beginning of July.



2020 Graduation Parade Route



Once finished with Truro follow the bus to New Virginia





BBQ Burgers

Sauce:

1 c ketchup
½ c packed brown sugar
1/3 c honey
¼ c molasses
2 tsp prepared mustard
1 -½ tsp Worcestershire sauce
¼ tsp salt
¼ tsp Liquid Smoke
1/8 tsp pepper



Burgers:

1 egg, beaten
1/3 c quick-cooking oats
¼ tsp onion salt
¼ tsp garlic salt
¼ tsp pepper
1/8 tsp salt
1 ½ lbs ground beef
6 hamburger buns
Toppings of choice

In small saucepan, combine all sauce ingredients. Bring to boil. Remove from heat. Set aside 1 c BBQ sauce to serve with burgers.

In a bowl, combine the egg, oats, ¼ c of the remaining BBQ sauce, onion salt, garlic salt, pepper and salt. Crumble beef over mixture; mix well. Shape into six patties. Grill, covered, over medium heat for 6-8 minutes on each side or until a meat reaches 160 degrees, basting with ¼ c BBQ sauce during last 5 minutes. Serve on buns with toppings of your choice and the reserved BBQ. Serves 6

Education: Governor Reynolds and the Iowa Department of Education have announced that all school districts and nonpublic schools will be closed for the remainder of the school year. Test Iowa Initiative: Governor Kim Reynolds launched the Test Iowa Initiative to expand testing capacity to limit the spread of COVID-19 in Iowa. The Test Iowa Initiative includes an assessment that will inform Iowans of their current health status, whether or not they should get a COVID-19 test, and instructions on how to get tested. The Assessment can be repeated as a person's situation changes. 80,000 Iowans accessed the program during the first 24 hours it was on line, with over 200 being scheduled for testing.

Vote Safe Iowa: the Secretary of State's Office will be sending a mailing, which includes an absentee ballot request form and instructions, to active registered voters. This mailing is projected to reach voters' mailboxes the last week of April and is to all active registered voters, and not just those who are currently registered as members of the Democratic and Republican parties. Iowa law allows voters to change their party affiliation at any time, including on election day, in order to vote in the June Primary. Voters may update their party affiliation using an absentee ballot request form. The Secretary of State's Office has refocused their Primary Election media campaign to include additional calls to voters to utilize absentee voting. This campaign will seek to educate voters on the 3R's of voting in the June 2, 2020 Primary Election: Request an absentee ballot. Receive your ballot. Return your ballot. Request. Receive. Return.

USDA Reminds Iowa Producers to Complete Crop Acreage Reports

DES MOINES, IA, May 1, 2020 – USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices in Iowa are currently open to phone and virtual appointments only but can still work with producers on timely filing crop acreage reports. FSA staff can provide assistance over the phone, by mail, email and through virtual meetings via Microsoft Teams.

The following acreage reporting dates are applicable in Iowa:

July 15, 2020 Corn, Soybeans, Perennial forage, Spring seeded small grains

December 15, 2020 Fall-seeded small grains

"In order to comply with FSA program eligibility requirements, all producers must file an accurate crop acreage report by the applicable deadline," said SED Amanda De Jong, State Executive Director. Our FSA staff is still able to assist producers in completing acreage reports, including providing maps."

FSA county offices in Iowa will provide maps to producers through mail or email with instructions for completing the maps. After planting is complete, producers should return completed maps and the acreage reporting sheet by mail, email, electronic drop box or a secure physical drop box at the county office as soon as possible.

FSA offices are using Microsoft Teams software to virtually meet with producers to review maps and documents for certification. Producers who want to schedule a virtual appointment can download the Microsoft Teams app on their smart phones and call the FSA office for an appointment. You can also use Microsoft Teams from your personal computer without downloading software.

After completed maps and all acreage reporting information is received, FSA will make software updates and mail or email producers the completed Report of Acreage form (FSA-578) to sign. Producers must return the signed form certifying their acreage report to the FSA office through mail, email, electronic drop box, or a secure physical drop box located at the county office by July 15, 2020.

The following exceptions apply to acreage reporting dates:

If the crop has not been planted by the acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after planting is completed.

If a producer acquires additional acreage after the acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 30 calendar days after purchase or acquiring the lease. Appropriate documentation must be provided to the county office.

Producers should also report crop acreage they intended to plant, but due to natural disaster, were unable to plant. Prevented planting acreage must be reported on form CCC-576, Notice of Loss, no later than 15 calendar days after the final planting date as established by FSA and USDA's Risk Management Agency.

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) policy holders should note that the acreage reporting date for NAP-covered crops is the earlier of the dates listed above or 15 calendar days before grazing or harvesting of the crop begins.

For questions, please contact your local FSA office. To locate your local FSA office visit farmers.gov/service-center-locator.

USDA Service Centers are open for business by phone appointment only and field work will continue with appropriate social distancing. While our program delivery staff will continue to come into the office, they will be working with our producers by phone, and using online tools whenever possible. All Service Center visitors wishing to conduct business with the FSA, Natural Resources Conservation Service, or any other Service Center agency are required to call their Service Center to schedule a phone appointment. Council Meeting Minutes - May 2nd 2020

The Council met in regular session on Saturday May 2nd, 2020 at 7:30 a.m. for the May Council Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Huston with Council Members Galivan, Nelson, Strange, Truman and Zuercher present.

Minutes from the April Council Meeting and Treasurer’s Report were approved.

Nathan Chandler was present to discuss a storm water drainage issue on his property. There is a culvert that goes under Maple Street and drains onto his property to the west. Chandler is planning on raising his house and is concerned that the water draining onto his property will cause a long-term problem regarding his proposed project. Chandler gave the Council a flash drive that has video of the water flowing through his property. Steve Savage will be contacted to look the situation over to see if a solution can be Devised.

A drainage problem on the back side of 807 East Street was reviewed and discussed. It is unknown if there is an old well, a plugged drain tile or just a high water table in the area.

It was suggested to have a group meeting with all the adjoining neighbors to try and come up with a solution to the problem with input from Steve Savage.

The light for the welcome sign in the cemetery stays illuminated 24 hours a day. An electrician will be contacted about fixing the light so it only comes on at night.

The drop-off at the west end of Knotts Street where it meets the county gravel road was discussed. The area has not had any gravel put in place to fill in the drop off. Whether it is the City or county’s responsibility, it needs to be taken care of. The City does have some gravel on hand.

The council was advised there is a graduation parade planned for May 24th. The City has not been contacted by the school as of yet regarding this event. It was discussed parents of graduating seniors are considering a possible banner and where to place it. All of the light/power poles are owned by Alliant Energy now so they cannot be used.

The council was informed there will be a drive-through car parade on June 17th.

There has been illegal open burning of mattresses, furniture, etc. going on for approximately the last two weeks at 300 East Street that has been giving off black smoke and a very bad odor. The fire department was called to this location this week. The property owner was informed what they were burning was illegal and to put the fire out. The property owner was also informed if the burning continued, there would be a citation issued by the Warren County Sheriff for illegal burning.

There will be a note placed in the water bills regarding open burning.

Dogs running loose around town and being aggressive is becoming a big problem. There will be information placed on the city website with ordinances pertaining to dogs being required to be tied up.

The water service and water rates ordinances were reviewed for changes. The City Attorney will be contacted about other cities water ordinances before making final changes to the existing New Virginia water ordinances.

The fire department ordinances have been forwarded to the City Attorney for final draft and will be ready for the June council meeting. The Virginia Township Trustees have had their two required meetings as part of the process of having the City take over operation of the fire department. City Attorney Stuyvesant is working with the Warren County Attorney’s Office to prepare the required documents for the June council meeting regarding the City taking over operation of the fire department.

Strange moved, seconded by Galivan to pass and approve Resolution #2020-05 – RESOLUTION APPROVING A 28E AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF NEW VIRGINIA, IOWA AND VIRGINIA TOWNSHIP, WARREN COUNTY, IOWA REGARDING FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICES. A roll call vote was taken: 5 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

Law Enforcement – The report summary from the Sheriff’s Office for the month of March was reviewed. Fifty-seven calls were received or initiated in the community during the month. Four citations/warnings were written in the New Virginia area. Officers logged in excess of 58 hours for the month in the community.

The Disaster Emergency Proclamation regarding COVID-19 for the City of New Virginia was discussed. As long as citizens adhere to and abide by the 6 foot social distancing, it was agreed to open the Hen House and the playground equipment and to remain following the Governor’s recommendations. Galivan moved, seconded by Truman to open the Hen House and playground equipment in the parks with this being subject to change according to any future recommendations of the Governor. A roll call vote was taken: 5 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

The current city budget and fund balances were reviewed. All financial budgetary functions are within the budgeted dollar amounts so no budget amendments will be needed.

GAMP FINANCIAL UPDATE- May 2, 2020

The following are the balances for the GAMP accounts: Money Market \$23017.37; Regular Account \$935.37. The GAMP Community Building has been closed for any and all use due to COVID-19. We will be working with parties to reschedule all rentals for future dates.

NEW VIRGINIA PLAYGROUND COMMITTEE UPDATE

We have not met due to COVID-19 restrictions. Our trash bins and grills have been completed. We will look to get those when possible due to COVID-19. We reviewed our grants – Jennifer has not heard back from Prairie Meadows regarding the completion of the projects. We will schedule the construction on the new shelter as soon as we can. Our account balance is \$13,974.05. The ditch on the south side of the park is not finished yet. Steve Savage will be contacted about getting this finished and gravel put in and get the old shelter removed and concrete broken up and removed.

KEEP IOWA BEAUTIFUL PROGRAM

Nothing new to report. The account balance is \$169.00. The need for signs that read NO PARKING THIS SIDE OF STREET for the south side of Broadway between West and Border Streets was discussed.

There will be a meeting Thursday May 14th at 7:00 p.m. at GAMP Park to discuss ordinance update changes.

Nelson moved, seconded by Zuercher to approve payment of all City bills and GAMP bills. A roll call vote was taken: 5 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

With no further business to come forth, Zuercher moved, seconded by Nelson to adjourn meeting. A roll call vote was taken: 5 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 10:25 a.m. The June council meeting is scheduled for Monday June 8th, 2020 at 7:00



USDA Offers Farm Loans for Farmers Facing COVID-19 Related Challenges

DES MOINES, IOWA, May 7, 2020 — The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) reminds producers that FSA offers farm ownership and farm operating loans to agricultural producers who may not find success obtaining loans from their traditional financial institutions because of COVID-19. Farmers who cannot obtain commercial credit from a bank can apply for FSA direct or guaranteed loans.

"Farming and ranching is a capital-intensive business and FSA is committed to helping producers maintain their agricultural operations during this time of crisis," said Amanda De Jong, FSA State Executive Director in Iowa. "FSA loans are designed to assist beginning and historically underserved farmers and ranchers, as well as those who have suffered financial setbacks from natural disasters or economic downturns. Producers may find that an FSA loan is the best option for them if they cannot qualify for a loan with their traditional financial institutions or other financial institutions because of COVID-19."

USDA offers a variety of loans to meet different production needs. Direct loans are made to applicants by FSA. Guaranteed loans are made by lending institutions who arrange for FSA to guarantee the loan. FSA can guarantee up to 95 percent of the loss of principal and interest on a loan. The FSA guarantee allows lenders to make agricultural credit available to producers who do not meet the lender's normal underwriting criteria.

The direct and guaranteed loan program offers two types of loans: farm ownership loans and farm operating loans. Farm ownership loan funds may be used to purchase or enlarge a farm or ranch; purchase easements or rights of way needed in the farm's operation; build or improve buildings such as a dwelling or barn; promote soil and water conservation and development; and pay closing costs.

Farm operating loan funds may be used to purchase livestock, poultry, farm equipment, fertilizer, and other materials necessary to operate a farm. Operating loan funds can also be used for family living expenses; refinancing debts under certain conditions; paying salaries for hired farm laborers; installing or improving water systems for home, livestock or irrigation use; and other similar improvements.

Repayment terms for direct operating loans are scheduled from one to seven years. Financing for direct farm ownership loans cannot exceed 40 years. Interest rates for direct loans are set periodically according to the government's cost of borrowing. Guaranteed loan terms and interest rates are set by the lender.

Iowa Health Care Foundation Scholarships Application Deadline May 31st

Scholarship Offerings
