

A Local Inventor from Long Ago, The Story of Jesse Livingood



The kit consisted of a front axle (converted from the standard Model T rear), a revised front spring, a transfer case, a front drive-shaft, and some miscellaneous pieces. The first kit used a single speed, chain-driven transfer case with an in-out lever for the front output. The later conversions incorporated a Warford auxiliary transmission which was a two- or three-speed box and had full-time 4-wheel drive with a lockable center differential. The two-speed unit had an under-drive to aid the model T's "rip-snorting 20 horsepower engine" (as stated in the advertisement), on rough terrain and a 1:1 ratio for the flat ground. In the three-speed Warford, an Overdrive was added, and the later engines were able to handle it.

The 4-wheel drive Model T was the Jeep of the era. According to the advertisement, "This 4-wheel drive attachment for the Ford car drives and brakes on all four wheels to provide more traction with less fuel cost, less tire expense and fewer repair bills. The Ford will now go through mud, sand and snow without the use of tire chains on any of the wheels. The unit can be attached to any Ford chassis in three to four hours".

The conversion was good enough that Ford wanted to purchase the design outright. Livingood countered by asking for an exclusive marketing arrangement to sell the kits through Ford dealerships as an authorized accessory. Ford refused, leaving Livingood to struggle on his own. Interestingly, the idea Jesse proposed is exactly what Marmon-Herrington did just a few years later with its own 4x4 conversion for Ford.

As an article in The New Virginian October 12, 1916 reads: "Some Invention: Jesse Livingood has been exhibiting a model for an auto truck of his own invention that looks like a winner. It steers and brakes from all four wheels. Mr. Livingood is planning to organize a company for the manufacturing of the motor truck. This young man is a genius, and we hope he makes good with this."



"Necessity is the mother of invention" is a proverb. A proverb is a short, common saying or phrase that gives advice or shares a universal truth. Often a proverb is so familiar that a speaker will only quote half of it, relying on the listener to supply the ending of the proverb himself. When put in a difficult situation, one is likely to be inspired to create a solution. The need to travel on Iowa roads during the 1900's was the situation, and the 4-wheel drive invented by Jesse Livingood in 1914 was the solution.

The first opportunity for many Americans to join the automobile age was through the Model T. Built from 1909 to 1927, the Model T was simple, inexpensive and came in one color, black.

When the Model T was invented, the 4x4 manufacturers in the United States built large trucks. The Four-Wheel Drive Auto Company did offer a 4x4 touring car, but by 1912 with a limited market, they were forced to build 4x4 big trucks. The cost of anything 4-wheel drive was double the cost of a similar 4x2. It was cheaper to get stuck.

Jesse L. Livingood had a better idea. Working out of a corn crib on the family farm located three miles north of New Virginia, Jesse saw the need for the 4-wheel drive on the terrible roads of Iowa. He sought to develop a system at a cost more people could afford. In 1914 at the age of 20, he perfected a 4-wheel drive conversion kit for the Model T. The Model T's were lightweight, solid and available. The Ford Motor Company built 300,000 Model T's in 1914 at a base cost of \$550 (\$12,628.00 today).

SOME INVENTION

Under the name of Livingood Motor Truck Company nameplate, he did design and build a line of 4-wheel drive trucks. The company never got off the ground. A 1919 Model T touring car was Jesse's test machine and was photographed for an ad that ran in 1923. The car was stolen that year in Chicago. Jesse built another one that he drove until 1941.


Livingood continued making and perfecting 4-wheel drive kits for various Ford cars and some Chevrolets also, well into the 1930's. In information given by his son, Jesse, over 150 of these were made. He built and designed a pulley and ball thrust bearing (1927), differential transmissions (1931), four-wheel brakes (1932), two- and four-cylinder steam engines, a hot water furnace for home heating, speed governors and countless other mechanical variations. Though Jesse passed in 1961, his son Jesse R. resurrected the Model T conversion kits when he retired in the 1980's. He continued to build the kits, largely using his dad's tooling and sold a few each year.

Correction From Last Week's Cover Story:

Through the Years - A Walk Back in Time. The location of the Eagle Grove School noted in our cover article for January was incorrect. 

**City Of New Virginia
Council Meeting Minutes
February 8th , 2020**

The Council met in regular session on Saturday February 8th , 2020 at 7:30 a.m. for the February Council Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Huston with Council Members Galivan, Nelson, Strange and Truman present. Absent Zuercher. Minutes from the January regular Council Meeting and Treasurer's Report were Approved.

City wide curbside clean-up day will be Saturday, May 9th. TRM is reviewing the list of items that can and cannot be picked up. More information regarding the curbside cleanup day will be distributed closer to the May 9th date.

The Hen House scheduled renovation projects are complete. Citizens are encouraged to drop in and check out the new look of the Hen House.

Mayor Huston informed the Council there is a storm sewer washout behind the mini-storage building on the north side of Grand Street. Steve Savage is scheduled to repair the storm sewer.

There has been at least three different occurrences of a pitbull or pitbull type dog being loose and/or aggressive in the 300 block of Davidson Street as citizens are walking by this property with their own dogs. A certified letter was sent to the owner of the dog but the Post Office gave back the letter this week because it was never picked up. This issue will be further pursued through the Warren County Sheriff's Office.

A public hearing was held for the first reading of Ordinance #108. With no citizens present to approve or disapprove and no written or email responses regarding said Ordinance, Nelson moved, seconded by Truman to pass and approve the first reading of Ordinance #108 – AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEW VIRGINIA, IOWA BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO WATER RATES. A roll call vote was taken: 4 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried. The first 2,000 gallons or less per month will increase from \$20.59 to \$22.65. All usage over 2,000 gallons per month will increase from \$7.90 to \$8.90. The second reading of proposed Ordinance #108 will be held at the March 7th council meeting.

Law Enforcement – The report summary from the Sheriff's Office for the month of December was reviewed. Forty-nine calls were received or initiated in the community during the month. Six citations/warnings were written in the New Virginia area. Officers logged in excess of 55.25 hours for the month in the community.

Rezoning 505 West Street from commercial to residential property was discussed. Rezoning of the property can be done per the City Attorney if approved by the City Council. A floor plan drawing of the first floor was reviewed. The second floor apartment will be renovated for an eventual rental. The Council will request a sundowner clause be drafted and state that if the current property owners sell the property in the future that it be placed back into commercial zoning or be reviewed by the City Council for the property to remain residential. The Council also requests two egresses from the second floor apartment and to confirm if the lean-to portion on the west side of the building encroaches on the property of the owner to the west. If the above items are addressed and taken care of, the City Council will move forward with having a resolution and ordinance drafted to rezone the property from commercial to residential.

A public hearing was held for resolution #2020-03 – a resolution considering the Maximum Property Tax dollars requested in the maximum levy for affected property tax levies for fiscal year 2021. With no citizens present to approve or disapprove and no written or email responses regarding said resolution, Strange moved, seconded by Galivan to pass and approve RESOLUTION #2020-03 A RESOLUTION CONSIDERING THE MAXIMUM PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS REQUESTED IN THE MAXIMUM LEVY FOR AFFECTED PROPERTY TAX LEVIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021. A roll call vote was taken: 4 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

The proposed 2020-21 city budget was reviewed and discussed. Nelson moved, seconded by Truman to approve the 2020-21 New Virginia City Budget. A roll call vote was taken: 4 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried. Final budget forms will be completed and submitted to the Indianola Record-Herald for publication. A public hearing will be held at the March 7th , 2020 council meeting to adopt the 2020-21 New Virginia City Budget.

The review of the compilation of the Virginia Township financial records has been completed by the State Auditor's Office. City Attorney Stuyvesant will communicate with the Warren County Attorney's Office regarding drafting the necessary resolutions, ordinances, 28E agreements, etc. Stuyvesant also needs the amount of fire & EMS funds that will be transferred from Virginia Township to the City.

GAMP FINANCIAL UPDATE

February 8, 2020

The following are the balances for the GAMP accounts: Money Market \$30,824.39. Regular Account \$ 1,072.87

The rentals and building use is going well at GAMP. The tot time director has stepped down due to personal reasons. We will need to find a new director for the program at this time. The truck pulls this year will be June 27 th and September 19 th . The June pull will replace the Old Settlers Friday night pull.

NEW VIRGINIA PLAYGROUND COMMITTEE UPDATE

We have had two meetings in January. We reviewed quotes from 3 different vendors for the trash bins and grills. It was voted on and approved to purchase these from Herman's. There will be 5 trash bins – 3 for Lion's Park and 2 for Old Settlers Park (City to purchase those two). A date of March 7 th has been set for the Father/Daughter Dance. This will be held at the Legion Hall. The committee is working on all the details for the dance. We reviewed our grants – the ones we have applied for and the process for the new shelter. It was discussed to move the old shelter on the south side of Lion's Park to the west side of the Library. Our next meeting will be held right after the father/daughter dance on March 7 th . Our account balance is \$16,171.99.

KEEP IOWA BEAUTIFUL PROGRAM

Truman gave an update on items discussed at the Keep Iowa Beautiful January meeting. The items discussed included: the possibility of giving welcome baskets to new families that move in new to the community, painting a mural on the north side of the old fire station, sprucing up the appearance of the business and the buildings, banners and/or flower baskets on the poles in the business district of West Street, a sign out at the Interstate to try and get people into New Virginia. The account balance is \$169.00.

Updating the City Ordinances will cost \$2700.00. The City will get five copies of the ordinances and they will be able to be placed on the city website. The new city website was reviewed by the Mayor and Council. Check it out at www.newvirginia.com.

Nelson moved, seconded by Truman to approve payment of all City bills and GAMP bills. A roll call vote was taken: 4 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried. With no further business to come forth, Nelson moved, seconded by Galivan to adjourn meeting. A roll call vote was taken: 4 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried. 

Warren County Farm Bureau and Iowa Farm Bureau are offering scholarships of \$500 and \$1,000, respectively. Applications are available online at www.iowafarmbureau.com under the member benefits section. Applicants must be a child of a Farm Bureau member. For more information about joining the Warren County Farm Bureau, contact our office at 515-961-6261 or warren.county@ifbf.org. Membership is only \$40 for the year and members can receive many other benefits, including a free dinner at the Warren County Fair!

If you have a son or daughter attending college, they may be eligible for the scholarship. Returning college students are encouraged to re-apply as well. Iowa Farm Bureau awards \$1,000 scholarships annually to students pursuing the completion of a two or four-year college degree pursuing a major in agriculture, nursing or education (full detailed list of eligible majors can be found on the application).

The 2020 deadline to submit your application to the Warren County Farm Bureau office is March 1, 2020. The complete IFBF Scholarship application guidelines and county Farm Bureau directory are included in the application.

WASHINGTON, D.C., January 28, 2020 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reminds agricultural producers interested in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) 2020 general signup to enroll by February 28, 2020.

This signup is available to farmers and private landowners who are either enrolling for the first time or re-enrolling for another 10- to 15-year term.

"This is the first opportunity for general sign up since 2016, and we want producers and private landowners to know that we have just one month remaining," FSA Administrator Richard Fordyce said. "It is critical that they make their final determinations and submit offers very soon to take advantage of this popular conservation program."

Farmers and ranchers who enroll in CRP receive yearly rental payments for voluntarily establishing long-term, resource-conserving plant species, such as approved grasses or trees (known as "covers"), which can control soil erosion, improve water quality and develop wildlife habitat on marginally productive agricultural lands.

CRP has 22 million acres enrolled, but the 2018 Farm Bill lifted the cap to 27 million acres.

Signed into law in 1985, CRP is one of the largest private-lands conservation programs in the U.S. It was originally intended to primarily control soil erosion and potentially stabilize commodity prices by taking marginal lands out of production. The program has evolved over the years, providing many conservation and economic benefits. Marking its 35th anniversary in 2020, CRP has had many successes, including:

- Preventing more than 9 billion tons of soil from eroding, enough soil to fill 600 million dump trucks;
- Reducing nitrogen and phosphorous runoff relative to annually tilled cropland by 95 and 85 percent
- Sequestering an annual average of 49 million tons of greenhouse gases, equal to taking 9 million cars off the road;
- Creating more than 3 million acres of restored wetlands while protecting more than 175,000 stream miles with riparian forest and grass buffers, enough to go around the world 7 times
- Benefiting bees and other pollinators and increased populations of ducks, pheasants, turkey, bobwhite quail, prairie chickens, grasshopper sparrows and many other birds.

The CRP continuous signup is ongoing, which enables producers to enroll for certain practices. FSA plans to open the Soil Health and Income Protection Program, a CRP pilot program, in early 2020, and the 2020 CRP Grasslands signup runs from March 16, 2020 to May 15, 2020.

To enroll in CRP, contact your local FSA county office or visit fsa.usda.gov/crp. To locate your local FSA office, visit farmers.gov/service-locator.

Contact USDA Farm Service Agency Now to Enroll in Key Safety Net Programs – **Don't Let the March 16 Deadline Pass You By.**

The clock is ticking... March 16 is THE LAST day to make what is likely one of the most important business decisions you will make for your farming operation this year.

If you have not already visited your local Farm Service Agency (FSA) county office to make your 2019 election for either the Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) or the Price Loss Coverage (PLC) program and to sign your annual enrollment contract, you should call and make your appointment now. Many of you are gearing up to head to the field for spring planting, but I cannot stress enough the importance of not letting this deadline get lost in the hectic day-to-day obligations of farm life. If you fail to make an election and enroll for 2019 ARC or PLC, you will be ineligible to receive a payment for the 2019 crop year.

ARC and PLC provide financial protections to farmers from substantial drops in crop prices or revenues and are vital economic safety nets for most American farms. These programs cover 22 commodities produced in the U.S.

FSA anticipates more than 1.7 million producers will enroll in ARC or PLC - that's a lot of producers to assist in a short period of time. As of February 3, FSA records in Iowa show 31,691 farms out of an expected 151,279 farms have completed ARC or PLC election and enrollment for the 2019 crop year.

Want to maximize your time visiting with FSA? Inquire about deadlines and options for also enrolling in 2020 ARC or PLC by June 30, 2020 and updating 2020 PLC payment yields by September 30, 2020. Our staff will help you make the most out of your visit or set you up with a future appointment to help check FSA programs off your lengthy "to do" list.

If you're still unsure about the choice of ARC or PLC, we offer online decision tools to help you determine the best program election for your farming operation. To access these tools, visit www.fsa.usda.gov/arc-plc.





Tap water is safe, affordable, sustainable and convenient.

- Studies show that bottled water is no safer than tap water. 
